Jess cheered on as 22 brave volunteers, led by her Mum Jo, rose to her challenge and whizzed down the longest zip wire in Europe, the Titan in North Wales. Accompanied by the Four Muskebears mascots, Jess's Gang has raised over £1,400 with Gift Aid in sponsorship for Shropshire Disability Network, MacIntyre and Guide Dogs. Jo tells us how she felt on the day (eye damage sadly prevented Jess from riding the zip wire)...

"When 6th October arrived I'm not sure what I was thinking – excitement, nervous, what on earth was I doing, 'Jess, what have you got me into!' When we reached the Titan it was raining and miserable, but as everyone congregated it was clear we were all up for the challenge and more importantly we were there to raise money for Jess's three charities.

"I can honestly say it was one of the best things I have ever done and everyone came off saying, 'Can we do it again!' I was only sad that Jess was unable to experience it, as she would have loved it. Coming down the last zip wire, it was so lovely to see her waving and smiling. We have hopefully surpassed our target – thank you to everyone who has donated!"

Winter will soon descend, the trees will soon be bare and our heating will need to be turned up another notch. So my message is, try to 'Keep Warm, Keep Well This Winter'. The government's Warm Home Discount Scheme provides certain households at risk of fuel poverty with a one-off discount of £140 on their electricity bill. We were very busy as people sought information from us. As your Chair, I am proud to share with you that we have achieved Disability Confident Committed (Level 1) in this scheme. This gives our charity extra credibility and I look forward to working with them for the benefit of all people with disabilities.

Powys Welcomes Safe Places Shropshire

Safe Places Shropshire coordinators from Shropshire Disability Network (SDN) were invited to Welshpool in neighbouring Powys to tell people about the Safe Places scheme. This was in cooperation with the local Police Community Support Officers.

We are delighted to announce that Welshpool is embracing the scheme with open arms. The fantastic first five local charities and businesses to sign up as Safe Places are: Ponthafren Association, Rikki Lloyd Family Butcher, Welshpool Jewellers, Coco Coffee House, and British Heart Foundation shop.

A Safe Place provides a short-term haven for anyone who is vulnerable when they are out in the community.

If anyone feels scared or threatened or has a crime committed against them while they are out, they can go into a Safe Place to ask for support. Some people carry a card bearing details of a trusted person whom a Safe Place member of staff can call.

Unearth The Secrets Of Your Local Burial Ground

The Beautiful Burial Ground Project is offering a free training session at Shropshire Archives to Shropshire Disability Network (SDN) members who are interested in the stories told by our burial grounds.

The project is run by the charity Caring for God's Acre, and this session follows an intriguing nature walk at Longden Road Cemetery in Shrewsbury in the summer, which SDN members thoroughly enjoyed.

The training session will take place at Shropshire Archives, Castle Gates, Shrewsbury, SY1 2AQ, from 1.30pm to 3.30pm on 25th February 2019. It will cover an introduction to the Archives as well as how to use the Archives to investigate the lives and stories harboured in your local burial ground.



The burial grounds in the midst of our communities tell us about changing fashions and traditions and immigration and about lives both long-lived and tragically short. Come along to this session and learn which resources to use when investigating the stories behind the stones where you live.

Accessible

Shropshire Archives are accessible to wheelchair users. A hearing loop is installed. A British Sign Language interpreter will be provided if required.

The Archives have a 'clear star viewer' which uses CCTV technology to enlarge pages from printed books for you. They also have a hand-held video magnifier which you can use with documents and maps in the Search Room. Guides to sources can be printed in large text on request.

Some Blue Badge parking spaces are reserved for the session at the front door and staff are making additional parking available. This is down a flight of steps but drop-offs at the door are possible. The Beautiful Burial Ground Project will help with transport if required – please talk to SDN about this.

The charity was launched at an event attended by its founder Peter Jones, Mayor of Ludlow Tim Gill, former picture editor of The Times newspaper Paul Sanders, and BBC Radio Shropshire presenter Jim Hawkins. The event took place at the Ludlow Methodist Church on 17th October 2018.

Have Your Say On Children's Mental Health Services

BBC One's Panorama programme reported recently that "Britain is in the grip of a child mental health crisis and getting help is a postcode lottery".

Healthwatch Shropshire would like to know about the experiences of children, parents, carers and the professionals who support them in the Shropshire Council area.



Are our children getting the help they need when they need it? If you have used the services, what do you think? Are there gaps in provision? Healthwatch Shropshire is asking these questions as part of its Hot Topic looking at the recently launched 0-25 Emotional Health and Wellbeing Service in Shropshire.

This service includes two online services, Kooth and Helios, where people can access self-help, peer support, counselling and treatment. Support is offered through the BEAM drop-in centres along with face-to-face services from a multi-disciplinary Young People and Families Mental Health Service.

Healthwatch Shropshire's outgoing Chief Officer, Rachael Allen, said:

"We hear a lot in the national press about the mental health problems facing children in today's society and the services children can access. We really want to hear about the experiences people have of local services.

"We gather these experiences and feed them back anonymously to those organisations which provide and pay for the services. In this way user experience can help shape the development of services so that they truly meet the needs of the young people in Shropshire."


